High Court Claim Filed Over Serious Digital Privacy Violations

A civil claim has been filed in the High Court of Justice concerning serious digital privacy violations, including illegal surveillance, hidden cameras, misuse of private information, harassment, intimidation and digital exploitation involving AI-generated content.

To ensure transparency and counter false rumours circulating online, the claimant has published the claim number and redacted court documents on her website. These materials allow journalists and the public to independently verify that legal action is underway.

The legal action seeks injunctive relief, disclosure orders, damages, and protection from ongoing harm. The case raises urgent public-interest concerns about digital exploitation and the need for stronger safeguards to protect individuals from covert monitoring and misuse of personal data.

A public awareness campaign has been launched alongside the legal proceedings to educate the public about digital privacy risks, promote transparency, and encourage ethical behaviour from institutions and platforms.
